System Rebuilding Continues

The (EWW) is continuing its efforts of rebuilding the water system infrastructure that is responsible for delivering water service to more than 62,000 homes and businesses in NW Pennsylvania. 2018 will see the initiation of the final phase renovations to the Richard S. Wasielewski Water Treatment Plant, EWW's primary water filtration facility. Construction is expected to begin in the 3rd quarter and last approximately months. EWW's Cherry Street Pump Station is also receiving a full overhaul. With construction beginning late 2nd quar-

Construction on a water main replacement project on Peach Street from West 26th Street to Craig Street will begin in mid April and last approximately 6 months. Please be aware traffic delays will occur but access to local businesses will be maintained.

Finally, with the recent installation of a state-of-the-art fiber optic network, the SCADA (Supervisory Control

and Data Acquisition) system currently in place to control the water system from a central location, is being upgraded to a more robust system that will provide increased control and improved monitoring of all EWW water system facilities.

From new water mains, to pump station renovations, to overall building improvements, the EWW continues its ongoing efforts to provide for its customers "World-Class Water, First-Class Service". This goal can only be accomplished with sound and reliable water system infrastructure.

We depend on our drinking water supply daily - but where does that water come from?

The EWW raw water supply is obtained exclusively from Lake Erie. We are fortunate to operate two water filtration plants and pumping stations. Both plants are directly connected to a complex network of distribution lines that supply water to all of EWW's 62,000 plus customers. The older of our two facilities, the Chestnut Street Water Treatment Plant, has an intake that extends 17,641 feet into Lake Erie under 25 feet of water. Our newer facility, the Richard S. Wasielewski Water Treatment Plant, has an intake that is 8,745 feet in length and is submerged under 25 feet of water.

The EWW encourages you to get to know your local water source, so together, we can protect and preserve it.

Protecting our water source now ensures we have a sustainable drinking water supply in the future.
