S&P Reaffirms EWW's "A" Credit Rating

On September 5, 2018 the Erie Water Works refinanced a portion of its 2006 bond issue as well as its entire 2008 bond issue. By refinancing, the Erie Water Works was able to take advantage of lower interest rates available in today's municipal bond market. These lower rates produced a debt service savings of more than \$2.5M in 2018. The savings will be put right back into water system improvements. This was possible because of the solid "A" credit score the Erie Water Works received from the bond rating agency Standard & Poor's (S&P). This credit score tells potential bond investors, that the Erie Water Works is a financially stable organization, and when insuring its bonds, the Erie Water Works was able to secure a very reasonable premium which added to the savings. All of these factors play a part in generating the \$2.5M savings EWW realized with this most recent bond refinancing.

By maintaining a good credit score, being vigilant at monitoring the bond market, and taking advantage of low interest rates, the Erie Water Works does its best to keep water rates as low as possible while providing very high quality water and first class service to all its customers.

Gear Tower Project Complete

In early November 2017 crews from Alex Roofing, ROG's Inc., and Lakeshore Towing removed the Erie Water Works Gear Tower from Water Works Park at Presque Isle State Park to undergo a complete renovation at Donjon Shipbuilding.

Renovations are complete and the "lighthouse" was returned to Presque Isle State Park on Wednesday, September 12, 2018 in a new location making it more accessible to visitors.

The project was made possible through the efforts of several companies, Presque Isle Partnership, Presque Isle State Park and a very generous donation from the Dan and Sallie Shipley Charitable Fund.

It's time to prepare your home for winter!

When temperatures are consistently at or below 32°F pipes in your home may be vulnerable to freezing. Here are some preparation tips in advance of frigid weather.

- * Eliminate sources of cold air near water lines by repairing windows, insulating walls, closing off crawl spaces and eliminating drafts near doors.
- * Allow a small trickle of water to run overnight to keep pipes from freezing. The cost of the extra water is minimal compared to the cost to repair a broken pipe.
- * Open cabinet doors to expose pipes to warmer room temperatures to help keep them from freezing.
- * If your pipes freeze apply heat to the frozen pipe by warming the air around it. You can use a hair dryer, space heater or hot water.

If water is not restored and neighbors are experiencing the same problem it could be a water main break and customers should call the Erie Water Works 24-hour emergency number 814-870-8087.
